Fired-up Atoka received Hugo's first punt on their own 33 yard line. Jerry Maxey exploded for 32 yards on the Wampus Cats' first offensive play. Maxey took the ball to Hugo 35. Quarterback Doug Lillard swept wide on the next play and it was free sailing into the endzone. Lillard kicked to extra point to make the score 7-0.

Jodie Lemmons leaped on a fumble at the Atoka 45 and the Buffs took it over in six plays. The key play was a 24 yard pass from Greg Nash to Jim Wallace. On the next play Nash ran an option and scored. Stanley Ketchum booted his first of three extra points.

The first half ended with a 7-7 tie.

The Buffs came out with a

68-yard march in 16 plays. Buffs drove the ball to the one before time ran out in the third quarter. From a new formation, the single wing, Nash took it over with 2 seconds gone in the 4th quarter. Ketchum kicked the extra point to make the score 14-7.

Hugo made it 21-7 after Pat Adams recovered a fumble at the Atoka 48. Hugo drove down field with a key pass play from Nash to Wayne Sims. From the 30 and eight plays late, Nash scored his third touchdown of the night. Ketchum kicked the extra point to make it 21-7.

Hugo scored again after starting the drive at their own 46. Hugo passed its way down field with Nash hooking up

with Wallace for 18 yards. On the next play Nash hit Wallace across the middle and Wallace was home free. This play covered 28 yards and a touchdown.

Hugo defense held the Wampus Cats to a minus 2 yards total offense the second half.

The Buffs came out strong and fast to beat Ft. Smith easily 54-0. The Buffs received opening kickoff and marched to their own 35 yard line. On the 4th play of the game, quarterback Greg Nash rolled right on an option.

Nash tucked the ball away and raced home free on a 65 yard T.D. Stanley Ketchum boomed the extra point.

Jim Wallace got his 1st interception of the year when making a diving catch at the Hugo 45. Buffs scored again in 12 plays with Nash scoring his 2nd touchdown of the night from the 4 yard line.

The mighty Buffs marched 77 yards for the next touchdown after the bandit defense forced St. Anne's punt. Phillip Baer, Buffs leading groundgainer, scored on an off-tackle play from the 5. Ketchum kicked the extra point.

The majorette camp was just a little different this year.

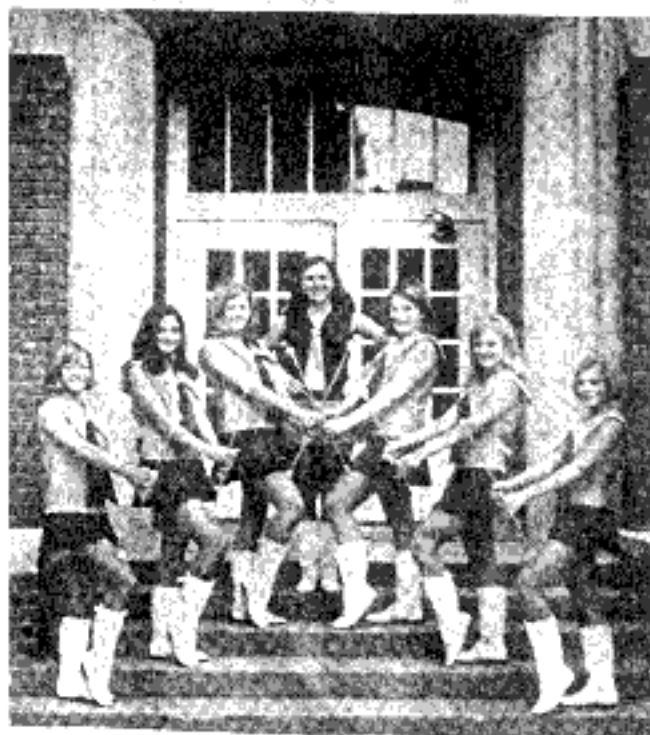
The instructors came to Hugo from E.T.S.U. instead of the majorettes going there!
