

## Hugo Rips Seminole Vo-Tech School for Hugo

Hugo's bandit defense robbed Seminole of only 25 total yards, all of which came on passes. Buffs defense dropped the Chieftains running backs 14 of 24 running attempts and their passing was off a little too. Seminole connected on 2 of 17 attempts for 25 yards. Hugo rolled up 377 total yards. The Buffs first points came on a safety with Ben Butler tackling Seminole's Mike Walker in the endzone.

These were Butler's only points in his high school career because it is not very often that a lineman scores. Hugo scored again after Seminole kicked off from their 20. The march was 34 yards with one key play. Greg Nash ran the option and was hit as he lateraled the football to Alan Upchurch who went 16 yards to the 6. Two plays and 3 yards later Phillip Baer bulldozed his way into the

endzone. Ketchum kicked his first of four extra points. The Buffs put together a 72 yard drive for their second touchdown. The key play was a pass from Nash to Jim Wallace that covered 42 yards. Wallace caught 3 passes for 71 yards in the game. Nash scored on a keeper from the 4 and Ketchum booted the extra point.

Hugo scored on a 64 yard drive at the start of the second half. The touchdown was set up by passes from Nash to Wallace for 23 yards and a 12 yarder to Gerald Hutchings. The touchdown came on a 13 yard pass to Upchurch. Ketchum kicked the extra point. Linebacker Pat Adams picked off a Chieftain pass at the Seminole 35. The Buffs drove to the five, but penalties kept them from scoring. With 52 seconds remaining alternate quarterback Phil Crane connected on a 35 yard touchdown to Tony Harris. Ketchum kicked his fourth extra point. The game ended as Hugo's sixth victory, 30-0.

The Kiamichi Vocational Technical School now under construction may soon be a new class room for IHHS. By next spring enrollment, the classes available to our students will be known. The different subjects offered will be cabinet making, mechanics, body and fender repair, plumbing, beautician, child

care, office work, and commercial sewing. These classes will be taken in a three hour period much like D. O. and I. C.T. are now.

## Hugo Meets Madill

In a free wheeling game Hugo came out on top of Madill 35-27. Madill scored on the first play of the game with Larry Woods scoring on a cross-country run of 74 yards. Hugo marched 41 yards with Baer scoring from the three. Ketchum's kick was off. With fourth and 21 from the Madill 16, Madill was forced to punt. Louis Peard was able to get his hand on the ball and knocked it out of the endzone. This 2 points gave Hugo an 8-7 lead. Madill had to kick from their 20 and the ball went out of bounds. Hugo got possession at the Madill 40. Quarterback Greg Nash rolled right on the first play and connected with split-end Jim Wallace for the touchdown to make the score 14-7. Madill stopped the extra point. The Buffs scored once more in the first half with Baer using his block to score from the 16. This touchdown came after a 64 yard drive. The key play of the drive was an option play for 15 yards. On the play Nash faked Alan Upchurch and lateraled to Gerald

Hutchings who fought his way to the 16. Madill scored twice more in the first half. The first came on an 8 yard pass from Chipper Dudley to James Dry. Madill's 3rd touchdown came with 40 seconds remaining on a 19 yard pass from Dudley to Dry again. The score at halftime was 21-21.

Hugo came out roaring in the second half with a beautiful march of 82 yards with the touchdown that put them ahead to stay. Hugo scored from the three and 17 plays old in the second half with Nash scoring. Ketchum's kick was off. Hugo scored its last touchdown after tackles by Roy Thompson, Jodie Lemmons, Ben Butler, and Bob Cowley stopped Dudley on a fourth down play. Key plays of the final drive were a pass from Nash to Hutchings, another pass to Wayne Sims, and 3 yard run by Baer. The 3 yard run was a gamble play with fourth down and two yards. Nash scored his second touchdown of the night on a 3 yard keeper. On the try for the extra point, Nash hit Upchurch on the rim of the endzone for two points. These 2 touchdowns put Hugo ahead 35-21. Madill didn't give up, but came with a 38-yard touchdown pass from Dudley to Dry. Madill went for two but didn't make it. The final score was 35-27.

# Broken Bow Barely Beats Hugo

Broken Bow scored early in the game and held the Buffs for a 12-3 victory. The win kept Broken Bow's hopes up in their game next week with Idabel.

The Savages turned a fumble into a touchdown and Hugo never recovered. Broken Bow held the Buffs in the third quarter, but Hugo still got three points when Ketchum kicked a 21 yard field goal. The field goal made the score 6-3 in favor of Broken Bow.

Nash completed 8 of 14 passes and Broken Bow only 2 of 7. Wallace for Hugo made six catches for 59 yards and Hutchings caught two for 21 yards.

Nash made an outstanding 70 yard punt return with key blocks from Wallace, Jodie

Lemmons, Ray Gene Jones, Louis Pearl, Clay Pinson, and Derris Ray. The Savages finally caught him at the 25.

Spurlock scored both of Broken Bow's touchdowns. He swept wide from the 6 for the first one, and from the 5 for the second touchdown.

Hugo marched 76 yards in the third quarter and kicked the field goal for the only three points they scored.

It seemed as though the scoring was over but Broken Bow while running out the clock scored again with only 1:15 left on the clock. The Savages kicked off, but the Buffs could not do much with only a little over a minute left in the game.

# Idabel Edges Buffs

The Idabel Warriors edged out Hugo to be undefeated in District 5-A play. On the first play Idabel went for a bomb, but the ball was deflected and Clifford Evans intercepted it at Idabel's 28. Six plays later Hugo was on the score board with Alan Upchurch scoring from the five. Stanley Ketchum kicked the extra point. Idabel came right back with a 57 yard drive. The key play was on 2nd and 8 from their own 45. It started out as a fumble and the ball went down field where Idabel recovered on the Hugo 35 for a 20-yard gain. The Warrior scored with Blackwell scoring from the 18. The extra point was good to even the score at 7-7.

Idabel recovered a fumble at the Hugo 41 on the kickoff, but they didn't score. Idabel was stopped at the 21 after key tackles by Derris Ray, Roy Thompson, Bob Cowley, Jodie Lemmons, and Ben Butler. Idabel grabbed another fumble at the Hugo 6 and scored with quarterback Davis scoring on the first play. The extra point failed, but Idabel led 13-7 at halftime.

At the start of the second half Buffs rammed the ball down the Warriors' throats with running of Gerald Hutchings, Greg Nash, Alan Upchurch, and Phillip Baer, for a 55-yard drive that made the score even. Nash scored the touchdown from the 4, but the extra point failed. Idabel was in scoring territory again at the Hugo 31, but were stopped at the 23.
