The Value Of Did You Vote? A Diploma

What is the absolute minimum amount of education that young people need today? Ask leaders in private industry, armed forces, officials, or businessmen. One and all will tell you that twelve years of school, denoted by a high school diploma is the bare essential for a young man or woman who is going out to compete with others for good civilian jobs or for special training and interesting assignments in the armed forces.

Why all this emphasis on the high school diploma? Why is the question "Are you a high school graduate?" always the first a young person hears when he inquires about joining one of the military services?

Let's look at some of the things this question tells about young people. First, the armed forces have found that the person who has graduated from high school has the ability to stick with a training program,

It indicates whether or not the individual has learned the value of education. As a graduate, he will be the one who wants more education, who can be depended upon to learn a job or special skill well,

Finally, it indicates the maturity and stability of the individual. If he is a graduate, he is quite likely to accept responsibility more readily than the person who has failed to finish high school

So this question "Are you a high school graduate?" identifies those individuals who can be depended upon to successfully complete special training and who are enthusiastic about learning more and improving themselves.

These are the people the armed forces need today, and they are willing to spend time and money training them to perform special tasks. Our defense forces are becoming more technical every day in this age of nuclear propulsion, automatic computation, and complex weapons systems. Military men still need physical stamina, but they need intelligence and the ability to use it above everything else.

We have recently had an election in which the student body participated. Did you vote? Many people didn't, and have you noticed, they're the ones who complain about who is elected? Why didn't you wate? Often the excuse, is, "no one was nominated that I wanted to vote for." Why didn't YOU nominate someone? Were you afraid?
