Former Hugo Coach Lands Langston Job

Albert Shoats, football and basketball coach at Booker T. Washington High School in Hugo in 1955-56 and 1958-57, has been named head football coach at Langston University succeeding Tim Crisp, who resigned last month.

Shoats, 40, is a graduate of both Muskogee Manual and Langston. He was a four-year football letterman at Langston and scored a school record seven touchdowns in a game against Wiley College of Marshall, Tex.

Shoats' four year record at Muskogee Manual was 28-13-3, and his 1969 team reached the state Class A finals. He was head basketball coach at Manual for four years before becoming football coach and had a 132-18 record. He coached at Paris, Ark.; Wellston; and Hugo before moving to Muskogee in 1962.

Shoats' appointment was announced Tuesday by Dr. William E. Sims, Langston University president. Sims said he would make formal recommendation for regents' approval at the board's February meeting.
