The first event won this year was a first place finish in the Southeastern State College Homecoming Parade. As an added honor, the band was featured in the pre-game show at the SSC Homecoming Game.

Following the annual Christmas Concert the musicians began preparation for the Spring Music Contests. In March the students entered the Arbuckle Band Day contest at Davis in three events. They captured First Division honors in all three events, with the Soul for Seven
