IN THE COUNTY COURT OF CHOCTAW COUNTY, OKLAHOMA.

HON. W. T. GLENN, COUNTY JUDGE.

Now on this 19th day of August, 1908, there coming on to be heard the petition of Millie J. Roberts and Moses Roberts for the approval of a certain deed made the 18th day of August, 1908, between the said parties and H. S. Bettés and Joseph M. Bettés, for the consideration of \$750.00: the Court having heard the testimony in behalf of the petitioners and being fully satisfied as to the facts, finds; that Millie J. Roberts and Moses Roberts are full blood Choctaw Indians duly enrolled as such on the approved Tribal Roll: that the said Millie J. Roberts was the wife of Alex Reed, deceased, who resided in what is now Choctaw county, if his death had occurred since statehood that the lands hereinafter described constitute a portion of the allotment of the said Alex Reed, deceased, and lie within the bounds of Choctaw county, and the jurisdiction of this Court, to-wit:

An undivided one-half interest in the NE/4 of Section 15, Twp 5, South, Range 18 East, and the E/2 of the SW/4 of and the E/2 of the W/2 of SW/4 of Section 16, Twp. 5 South, Range 3 West, being the entire allotment of Summie Taylor, and the NW/4 of Section 10, Twp. 5 South, Range 18 East, being the homestead allotment of Becky Taylor subject to the courtesy of Alex Reed.

The Court further finds that the said deed was made for a fair and adequate consideration, free from fraud and duress, and that there is no reason why the same should not be approved as provided by the Act of Congress effective July 27th, 1908, relative to the approval of deeds made by full blood Choctaws, et al,

It is therefore ordered, considered and adjudged by the said County Court of Choctaw, the said Hon. W. T. Glenn, County Judge, acting that the said deed be and the same is hereby approved.
