

In the County Court of Choctaw County, Oklahoma.

Before the Hon. W. T. Glenn, County Judge.

Now on this 28th day of September, 1908, there coming on to be heard the petition of Isaac Nelson for the approval of the conveyance of his interest as a full blood heir in the estate of Georgia A. Nelson, deceased, and the Court having heard the testimony and being fully advised of the transaction finds:

That said Georgia A. Nelson departed this life intestate and without issue on or about the 21st day of October, 1904, leaving surviving her, her father and Allington, Leo, Grace, Patsy and James Nelson, her brothers and sisters, and left surviving her no other heir.

The Court further finds that each of said heirs including Isaac Nelson the father of said deceased are full blood Indians, and that the estate of said deceased properly stands for probate in Choctaw County,

The Court further finds that the said deceased at the time of her death was the owner in fee to the following described lands, to-wit:

The NW/4 and the N/2 of the SW/4 of Sec. 29, Twp. 7, South and Range 18 East.

The Court further finds that Isaac Nelson father of said deceased has executed a deed conveying his interest in the estate to William Frank of Paris, Texas, and being a full blood Indian it is necessary to have the approval of this Court in order to vest the title to the said lands in the said purchaser.

The Court further finds that the said deed was made for an adequate consideration free from fraud, duress and undue influence, and that it is the desire of the petitioner that the same be approved in order to vest the title in the said purchaser.

It is therefore, ordered, considered and adjudged by the said County Judge that the said deed be and the same is hereby approved,
