

In the County Court of Choctaw County, Oklahoma.
 Before Hon. W. T. Glenn, County Judge.

Now on this 6th day of October, 1908, there coming on to be heard the petition of James Coleman for the approval of the conveyance of his courtesy interest in the estate of his deceased wife, Susan Coleman, nee Jackson, and the Court having heard the testimony and being fully advised of the transaction finds:

That James Coleman is a full blood Choctaw, duly enrolled on the Approved Tribal Roll as an adult, and was the lawful husband of Susan Coleman, nee Jackson, in her lifetime, and is entitled to a courtest interest in her estate.

The Court further finds that the said Susan Coleman, nee Jackson, at the time of her death was the owner in fee of the following described lands to-wit:

The E/2 of the E/2 of the SW/4, and the W/2 of the W/2 of the SE/4 of Sec. 13, and the E/2 of the NW/4, and the NE/4 of the SW/4 of Sec. 24, all in Twp. 3, North, Range 8 West of the Indian Base and Meridian, in Grady County, Oklahoma.

The Court further finds that the said petitioner, James Coleman, has executed a deed to B. W. Williams and N. F. Miller for the purpose of conveying his interest in said lands to them, and being a full blood Indian, it is necessary to have the Approval of this Court in order to vest the title to the said lands in the said purchasers.

The Court further finds that the said deed was made for an adequate consideration, free from fraud, duress and undue influence and that it is the desire of the petitioner that the same be approved in order to vest the title in the said purchasers.

It is therefore, ordered, considered and adjudged by the said County Judge, that the said deed be and the same is hereby approved.
