Illie Thompson to Palmira Polly.

Now on this 29th day of September, 1908, this cause coming on to be heard, and all the parties interested and appearing in Court, after hearing the petition read and the testimony of the witnesses, the Court finds from the petition herein filed and evidence heard that Ille Thompson is a full blood Choctaw Indian, twenty-one years of age and a resident of choctaw County, Oklahome; and that she is an heir at law of the estate of Emiline Christie, deceased, who died intestate in what is now Choctaw County, Oklahoma on or about January, 1907, and was at the time of her death seized in fee of the following described estate of inheritance:

20 acres of Homestead allotment in Sec. 14, Twp. 6, South and Range 20 East, the remainder of said Homestead allotment having heretofore been sold to Palmira Polly.

The Court further finds from the petition filed and the testimony heard; that the said Illie Thompson on the 7th day of September, 1908, did make and execute a deed conveying to the said Palmira Polly all of her interest in said estate of inheritance in consideration of the sum of Sixty-five and no/100 Dollars, (\$65.00); that said consideration and sale is fair and equitable and in every particular satisfactory to paries hereto.

It is therefore ordered, adjudged and decreed that said deed of conveyance be and the same is hereby approved.
