

DECREE FOR APPROVAL OF DEED.

Now on this 21st day of November, 1908, this cause coming on to be heard, and all the parties interested being in Court; the Court after hearing the petition read and taking the testimony of witnesses, finds from the petition herein filed and the evidence heard; that Silas Jackson is a full-blood Choctaw Indian, more than twenty-one years of age, and a citizen of Choctaw County, Oklahoma; *died on or about the last days of July, 1906, intestate and* that Litle Jackson, deceased, was at the time of her death a citizen of what is now Choctaw County, Oklahoma, a full-blood Choctaw Indian and seized in fee of the lands described in said petition; and the said Litle Jackson died wholly intestate, and had no issue of her body or their decendants surviving her. nor husband.

The Court further finds from the petition herein filed and the testimony taken; that the said Silas Jackson is an adopted son of the said Litle Jackson, deceased.

The Court further finds that the said Silas Jackson, joined by Robert Cass, made and executed a deed conveying all their interest in said estate of inheritance to W. N. Greene and W. E. B. Leonard, in consideration of the sum of Five Hundred Twenty and no/100 Dollars, (\$520.00); and that said sum is an adequate consideration for said premises and in every particular satisfactory to parties thereto.

It is therefore ordered, adjudged and decreed that the said deed of conveyance be and the same is hereby approved .
