ORDER APPROVING DEED.

Now on this 23d day of November, 1908, there coming on for hearing the petition of Davis Himonubbe for the approval of a certain deed of conveyance executed by him to T. W. Tyler and W. P. Hillhouse on the 21st day of Nov., 1908, and the court having examined said petition, and being well and sufficiently advised in the premises doth find:

That Emmon Himonubbe, deceased, and Ella Himonubbe, deceased, were members by blood of the Mississippi Choctaw Tribe of Indians, and were enrolled by the Commission to the Five Civilized Tribes and approved by the Secretary of the Interior opposite numbers 950 and 951, as members of said Tribe of the full bloods; that the said Emmon Himonubbe departed this life on or about the 2nd day of Sept., 1904, intestate, at the age of 21 years, in what is now Choctaw County, Oklahoma, that there was allotted to Emmon Himonubbe, prior to his death the following described lands, situated in the County of Choctaw, State of Oklahoma, to-wit:

All of the S/2 of the SW/4, and the S/2 of the N/2 of the SW/4, and the E/2 of the W/2 of the NE/4 of Sec. 12, containing 160 acres of land, and the SE/4 of Sec. 12, containing 160 acres of land, or a total of 320 acres of land in Twp. 7, South, in Range 18 East, being the allotment of Emmon Himonubbe, deceased;

The Court further finds that the said Ella Himonubbe departed this life on or about the 18th day of February, 1907, intestate, at the age of 22 years, in what is now Choctaw County, Oklahoma, that there was allotted to Ella Himonubbe, prior to her death the following described lands, situated in the County of Choctaw, State of Oklahoma, to-wit:

The NE/4 and the NW/4 of Sec. 13, in Twp. Seven South, in Range 18 E. containing 320 acres of land, all according to the United States Survey thereof; the last described lands being the allotment of Ella Himonubbe, dec'd.

The Court further finds that upon the death of the said Emmon Himonubbe and Ella Himonube, the petitioner, Davis Himonubbe, being the father became the heir at law of the said Emmon Himonubbe, deceased and Ella Himonubbe, dec'd that the petitioner is desirous of selling his estate in said lands; that the petitioner is ~~in the law-ful possession of said lands; that the petitioner has made, executed and delivered to T. W. Tyler and W. P. Hillhouse, of Hugo, Okla., a Quit-Claim Deed, conveying to the said T. W. Tyler and W. P. Hillhouse all right, title and interest in and to the said lands, and warranting the title to his life estate for his natural life to same for and in consideration of the sum of \$5.00 cash in hand paid; and the Court further finds that said sum is a fair and adequate consideration and not disproportionate to the value of his interest in said lands, and that the petitioner is fully satisfied there-with.~~

WHEREFORE, premises considered, it is hereby ordered, adjudged and decreed by the court that the said deed be and the same is hereby in all things approved and confirmed.
