O R D E R.

Now on this the 28th day of Nov., 1908, comes James Coleman, Susan Coleman, Forbes Williams, and Emma Williams, nee Cleman, and files and presents to the court their petition praying for an order of the court approving and confirming a certain deed of conveyance, executed by them to Arthur Adams, on the 20th day of October, 1908, to the following described real estate, to-wit:

An undivided $\frac{2}{3}$ interest in and to the N/2 of SW/4; S/2 of SW/4 of NW/4; S/2 of SE/4 of NW/4 all in Sec. 29, T. 6 S. R. 4 E.; also S/2 of NW/4, N/2 of NW/4 of SW/4 of Sec. 1; SE/4 of SE/4 of NE/4; NE/4 of NE/4 of SE/4 of Sec. 2, Twp. 6 S. R. 6 E.; also SW/4 of NE/4 of NE/4 of Sec. 11, Twp. 8 N. R. 6 W. of the Indian Base and Meridian.

And the Court, upon consideration of the said petition, being fully advised in the premises, finds, that one Leander Crosby, a full blood Indian, a resident of that portion of the State of Oklahoma, now comprising Marshall County, State of Oklahoma, on the 25th day of June, 1907, died, seized of the lands above described, which said lands were allotted to him by the Choctaw and Chickasaw Nations, and conveyed to him under allotment and homestead patents, and that the said Leander Crosby was, at the time of his death the owner in fee simple of the said above described lands.

The Court further finds that the said petitioners^{are} the only surviving heirs at law of the said Leander Crosby, deceased.

The Court further finds that on the 20th day of Oct., 1908, the said petitioners executed to Arthur Adams, for and in consideration of the sum of Seven Hundred fifty Dollars, cash in hand paid, a Warranty deed for the above described real estate; the court further finds that the said deed was duly signed and acknowledged by the said petitioners, and that the consideration for said deed is fully paid, and that the same is reasonable, adequate and satisfactory to the said petitioner; and the court finds that the said conveyance of the said real estate to the said Arthur Adams should be, in all things approved and confirmed.

It is therefore by the Court considered, ordered, adjudged and decreed that the said conveyance of the said above described lands, by warranty deed, dated 20th Oct., 1908, from the said Petitioners to the said Arthur Adams be, and the same is hereby, in all things approved and confirmed, and declared legal and valid.
