

DR. DON MORGAN OF TEMPLE, OK

Don Morgan died July 31, 2006 at the age of 84. He was born July 23, 1922 in Canyon, Texas, the son of Bud Markham and his wife Rebecca Mae Bassett. His parents were divorced, and Mae married French Morgan in 1928.

French raised Don and his two brothers, Billy and Eddie, and then adopted them in 1942. French and Mae also had three other sons, J.B., Earl and Robert. Eddie, J.B., Earl and Robert are still living. Billy was killed in action in 1944 during bombing run over Bucharest. Don and Billy both graduated from Erick High School in 1941.

Don married Mildred Sue Barber, daughter of Rev. Davis D. Barber, on May 17, 1942, and they had four children, David, Donna, Susan, and Scott.

He served in the European Theater in World War II under General George Patton. After the war, he attended OBU and Southwestern State College, and then attended the Kansas City College of Osteopathy and Surgery, graduating in 1950.

He was a family physician, and practiced medicine in Lubbock, Texas, and in Tipton, Healdton, Madill and Temple, Oklahoma. He settled in Temple in 1962 and retired in 1988. His first wife died in 1986, and he married Carlene Hunt in

1988.
