Fort Towson's Representative Town Builders Not Boomers, But Wide Awake Citizens Who are in Line for Progress and Prosperity

Two of the pioneers and enterprising citizens of Fort Towson are Messrs. Joe and J.H. McDaniel, contractors and builders. They came here from Lamar County, Texas, their native home, soon after the townsite was established and took the contract to build the first business house put up in the new town. Their specialty, however, is brick and concrete work and they guarantee satisfaction, both being expert workmen. They also manufacture brick near Fort Towson and make their own concrete blocks for building purposes.

These gentlemen are permanent residents of Fort Towson and are helping push the town to the front. As evidence of their good faith they have built a residence, a brick building in which the Fort Towson bank is located and have just finished a substantial concrete building, which is the first of its kind in this part of the country.

Mr. Joe McDaniel is thoroughly acquainted with the large scope of territory tributary to Fort Towson, and having studied very carefully the topography of the country, the character of the soil and every feature that is necessary to the development of a good town, he makes the prediction, and very correctly too, that this town will have a population 5,000 people within the next four years.
